### Starting March 31

Gov. Holcomb announced yesterday that on March 31, all Hoosiers age 16 and older will be eligible to receive the vaccine.

**Please NOTE:** The Pfizer vaccine is the only one approved for use by the FDA for 16- and 17-year-old residents. Search by ZIP code for what type of vaccine is available and sites near you on [OurShot.IN.gov](https://ourshot.in.gov). Read the [governor's remarks](#).



### Current eligibility: 40+

Hoosiers age **40 and older** can now make a COVID-19 vaccination appointment at [OurShot.IN.gov](https://ourshot.in.gov). You must be an Indiana resident and show proof of age. That can be a photo ID or other document, such as a utility bill, bank statement, lease agreement or record from your doctor with your address and date of birth. ### Vaccines for Native Americans – March 27

state-recognized and historical tribes, as well as Native Hawaiians and Native Alaskans, and other native groups living in Indiana. Appointments are required, must be 18 or older. Second doses will be given on April 24. ### Homebound Hoosiers program

Are you, or a loved one, homebound and unable to travel to a vaccine site? Homebound Hoosiers connects residents who are eligible to receive the vaccine with their local Emergency Medical Services (EMS) provider to have the vaccine administered in their home. Contact your [local health department](#) or [Area Agency on Aging](#) to receive assistance arranging this service.



### Improved dashboard

The Indiana Department of Health's [vaccine dashboard](#) has been expanded. It now shows under the newly reported and total vaccinations the data for a single dose or two dose series. Under County Distribution, users can select a county to see its demographics or click and drag to select a group of counties. The graphic below showing vaccinations by date was also added.



To date, **992,664** Hoosiers have been fully vaccinated!
