

**AMENDMENT OF EMERGENCY ORDER
AUTHORIZING TEMPORARY PERSONAL CARE ATTENDANT
POSITIONS AND TRAINING FOR RESIDENTIAL CARE FACILITIES**

The Indiana State Department of Health's March 21, 2020 "Emergency Order Authorizing Temporary Personal Care Attendant Positions & Training for Residential Care Facilities" ("First PCA Order") is AMENDED as follows:

Effective March 16, 2020 through May 1, 2020, minors age 16 and 17 are also eligible for training and work as Personal Care Attendants ("PCAs"). This amendment is consistent with the Indiana Department of Labor's temporary suspension of enforcement of requirements for employers to have (1) on-file work permits for minor employees, and (2) permission letters from the school allowing minors (limited to those age 16 and 17) to work during restricted hours of 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. on E-Learning days. In all other respects, the First PCA Order is unchanged and remains in full effect.
